

PINE TREE QUILT GUILD GENERAL

MEETING MARCH 7, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 PM by President, Sophia Day.

Announcements:

Bernie Kringel could not attend the meeting tonight but wanted the guild to know that Doll Like Me received 350 small quilts from around the world. Bernie's business, NeedleandFoot, is one of the guild's affiliates. There's a link to A Doll Like Me if anyone wants to see stories on the quilts.

Diane Klose - Opportunity Quilt marketing. She is asking for a volunteer to show the quilt at the Folsom meeting March 13. She can do the March 20 showing in Sacramento but is open to a volunteer.

Judy Hamilton - Scholarship Chair. The guild will be giving a \$1500 scholarship for Fabric related majors and is asking for volunteers to go over the applications with her in April.

Margaret Vodicka has openings for the April workshop, rough appliqué. The cost is \$30.

Joan Mosely - Boutique co-chair, has 22 vendors signed up and room for more. They will also be displaying small quilts for sale that will be hung up instead of laying on a table.

Ginny Lee- Has basket commitment forms. April 16 is the deadline to deliver baskets to the committee.

Teresa Finn and Bonnie Lattin-Hensel - HWS - March HWS is full-tote bag. There are sign ups for another class by Robi Holmen for her tote bag. April's HWS is a pincushion/scrap bag taught by Bev Sarchett.

Molly Cook - Country Store- please sign up. She has room for more vendors

Ardy Tobin - Pick up rosters to avoid having to mail them. Check our website and "like" to become a facebook friend. We are trying to do frequent updates for guild happenings on Facebook. Appraisers for the quilt show charge \$25 for an oral appraisal and \$85 for a written one. Ardy is taking applications for anyone wanting a quilt appraised. This is for pre 1960 quilts only.

Holly Miner - treasurer - GVSD gave a \$50 check to reimburse PTQG for expenses incurred for a class taught by Karen Mitchell through Educational Outreach.

Lorna Straka announced that 2 mini groups have merged: Sew Happy and Uncommon Threads. They are now named Happy Threads. Lorna is also our hostess tonight for the March Mixer.

Linda Lasich is a certified quilt judge. She encourages members to observe the quilt show judging entries at the LDS church on May 3. There will be 2 judges with scribes taking notes. When quilts are judged, a certain pathway is followed. 1. General impression 2. Technique 3. the quilting itself. She encourages everyone to have a quilt judged. The judge will tell you how to improve your quilt in a positive manner.

There are 83 members present with 6 guests/new members. During the break, members voted on the quilt challenge arranged by Lois Hodges. Snacks were provided by the mini group, Happy Threads.

Sharon Ellisor spoke about Interfaith Food Ministry (IFM). She and several other members volunteer for this charity. Tonight, members brought food/donated money, and received raffle tickets. IFM has 500 volunteers and delivered 100,000 bags of food to clients in 2017. Sharon and her husband will deliver tonight's donations. She thanked us all for our help and donations.

5 prizes were raffled by Sally Monestier. Winners were Deirdre Campbell, Lillian (a new member tonight), Tamara Cook, Holly Miner, and Carey Daly. The prizes were all from Trudy Ferreiro's estate, a member who passed away last year.

Quilt Jeopardy was then played with Lorna as master of ceremonies. Prizes were given to game winners and a few prizes left were raffled.

Lois Hodges announced the challenge winners. Best Traditional- Lorna. Best Art - Ginny Lee Best Applique - Deirdre Most Humorous - Deirdre, and use of theme and favorite quilt - both Karla Rogers

The meeting was adjourned at 8:30 PM.
