General Meeting Minutes

Tuesday, October 5, 2021

Online Zoom

Called to order at 6:32 pm by President Barbara Ceresa.

Attendance: 33 Members

Announcements – Barbara Ceresa:

1. General meetings of the Guild for the remainder of 2021 will be held on Zoom.
2. The speaker program and workshop scheduled for November have been cancelled. Checks for prepaid workshop registrations will be shredded. Arrangements to have a check returned rather than shredded need to be made directly with Anne Wilson.
3. Vice President Lillian Glaeser reminded everyone that nominations for the Hall of Honor should be sent to her via email or regular mail delivery. The closing date for nominations is October 10th, and the committee will meet after that date to consider the nominations.
4. Holly Miner reported that the 2022 Executive Board has been affirmed by the online vote of 54 members. Congratulations to the new board:

Holly also shared that there was a unanimous vote by responders to accept the proposed dues reductions for 2022. Membership renewals will be \$15, affiliate renewals will be \$30. The membership forms will be online and can be submitted, beginning in November or December. Dues for new members will be \$30, new affiliates \$45. Members must submit forms by January 15, 2022, to be included in the first published Roster.

5. Affiliate Karla Rogers presented information about Precision Quiltworks, the longarm quilting business that she and her husband, John, began in 2009. They offer computerized quilting as well as custom work on 'Hal', their Gammill longarm. They use Superior brand threads and feature patterns from antique to modern that are adjusted appropriately for the individual quilt. Karla will pick up and drop off in convenient town locations, and can offer a timely return with the advantage of two of them working on a project. Hobbs Heirloom batting is available, but she also encourages local purchase. She shared photos of completed quilts. 6. Sue Miller gave an update about the 2022 Quilt Show, reporting that the rental quote from the fairgrounds is \$10,320, a significant increase over previous years. The non-profit discount has been eliminated, and the building rental fees have increased. Discussion with reactions and

suggestions followed, with Sue thanking everyone for their input. There will be more information in the November Newsletter.

SHOW AND TELL:

Photos submitted by 11 members offered a look at wonderful creations including some that were chosen for being 'most difficult' or 'most fun'. Projects included an ombre quilt, a pet portrait, a one block wonder pattern from a panel print, Halloween quilts and tablerunners, an award-winning sampler quilt, as well as quilts for family, friends, and the challenge of new techniques. It was a kaleidoscope of color and design!
