Called to Order at 6:35 by Co-Vice President Susanne Haislet (stepping in for Lillian Glaeser who was not in attendance)

Attendance: 33 members

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

1) Susanne Haislet asked for a show of hands for who's planning on submitting a challenge quilt for March (birth month flower). Four raised their hands.

2) There was a discussion about having a mentor for new members. Susanne Haislet is looking for mentor volunteers. Holly Miner, Robi Holmen and Anne Wilson volunteered. A suggestion was made to tie the mentor volunteers in with hospitality, with the hospitality chair introducing the mentor to the new member.

2) Joan Mosley: Asking members to bring items for baskets for the quilt show as soon as possible; they would like to start assembling the baskets. She will be at community service this Thursday, to take items. If anyone has extra baskets to donate, she will be taking those as well. Joan also reminded members that they need people to sell tickets at the quilt show. You can sign up for a shift through Sign-Up Genius, which was sent to general membership in a blast. It was suggested that we have a printed sign-up by the March meeting. Anne Wilson reminded the group that we also need Gate sign-ups.

3) Sheri Doer: The Scholarship application date closes on March 15. There are 8 applicants so far to review. She needs a committee to volunteer to help review. The committee will have 2 weeks to do the evaluations as NU Joint Unified announces on April 1. We have \$1500 for one scholarship, or \$750 each for two scholarships, depending on what the committee decides.

4) Two new members, Norma Solarz and Maryanne Kingman, was introduced. Welcome Norma and Maryanne.

5) Sue Marshall: Sue and Lillian Glaeser will be at the JC Penney's parking lot this Friday, February 4,, from 10-12 for country store disbursement for the quilt show. You need a new form for 2022 if you want to be a vendor.

6) Judy Hamilton: Silent Auction is accepting donations We have some items from the 2020 show, but are always willing to take more donations.
