GENERAL MEETING

SEPTEMBER 4, 2018

The meeting was called to order by Vice President, Lorna Straka.

Lorna introduced the visiting Opportunity Quilts from the Golden Valley Quilt Guild and the Roseville Quilt Guild.

Jeanne Pincha-Tulley from the nominating committee, introduced the volunteers for next year's Executive Board: Lorna Straka - President, Barbara Ceresa and Joan Mosely - Co Vice Presidents, Holly Miner remains as Treasurer, and Sophia Day - Secretary. Others may volunteer for any position. Voting will be in October.

Marjorie McConnell, chair of Community Service, introduced Melissa Marcum from the Nevada County Office of Education. Melissa explained what services they offer. They use the term 'adulthood': assisting Foster Youth after high school graduation for college, employment, and food stamps - for ages 16-21. That office also provides a housing program for ages up to age 24. Community Services gives each Foster Youth, at graduation, a quilt, pillowcase, and satchel-type bag.
