Vaughn Rodriquez Patchwork Star February 2022



Down a long and winding bucolic path, the Rodriguez' five acre property bespoke restfulness and serenity. Both Vaughn and Robert are audacious hobbyists. They have bloomed nicely where they are planted. Silicon Valley good-bye! Their newest member of the family is a seven-month old lusciously red long-haired dachshund named Liberty. Vaughn has never been without a dachshund in her life! Libby is a sweet, eager to please "love-puppy" begging for and getting many treats. And, because Robert as a young boy won two goldfish at a carnival, his fascination for fish has continued and thrived. Who knew?! Their garage is converted into an exotic fish expo. Colorful squirming specimens making lots of bubbles and filling countless tanks are for sale. With an electrical engineering degree, Robert's expertise has also morphed into cars. He restores vintage Volkswagens. Wow!

An unhurried softness bespeaks Vaughn's zeal for quilting. Having sewn clothing and costumes for three children, she became immediately comfortable with quilting. A recent U-tube segment with Kate Brown has introduced her to upcoming quilt enthusiasts and a fantasy pattern dubbed "Mythical Dachshund". Vaughn is researching other pieced dachshund

possibilities. Spending seven years making a 25th anniversary memory quilt, Vaughn opined: "I learned I was a perfectionist when I was upset about not being able to tell the right side from the wrong side of a batik!" Then adding: "I love the joy of process. It gets me out of my comfort zone." This large anniversary quilt includes kitschy novelties evoking treasured family remembrances. Each block is flanked by five royal blue cornerstones at every juncture. Royal blue, Vaughn's favorite color, makes an appearance in most of her quilts. Pizza, bananas, dogs, otters, fish and the Hungry Caterpillar take up residence in subsequent smaller offerings. She is not averse to machine quilting herself. Sandra Bruce, however, helps out for larger attempts.

Vaughn's Grandmother and other family members long passed have bequeathed a trifecta of quilted heirlooms. Lovingly restored beauties from the 20's and 30's are in Vaughn's possession. Restoration techniques and proper provenance were addressed. Careful and patient handwork was evident, much hand embroidery included.

Upon Vaughn's sewing table sits a jar. Handfuls of one inch cardboard covered "hexies" were within. So many blues accompanied an arrangement of milky whites and yellows. Empty Duncan Hines cardboard boxes await the tedious cutting process. Vaughn is using a Creative Memories punch to aid this slow and crazy awesomeness. And then each cardboard cutout is covered with fabric to be hand basted on the back! Yikes!! Perhaps a small doily would be a good start. Vaughn explains: "I just needed something to do while watching TV."

Whence comes the art of the interview after nearly four hours of bonding, fellowship, candor and snacks. Alas, I believe the interviewer became the interviewee. Our pleasant time together revealed a kinship of



stark similarities. Sheepishly, Vaughn admitted two things: 1) I am not confident in choosing fabrics that go together; 2) I don't always have a clear plan when I begin a project." I suggested she design a "fish quilt" for Robert. Countless postcard patterns are Villa Rosa's mainstay of go-to easy fix possibilities. And, they will help you execute them. It will be fun to see what exciting new ideas Vaughn will add to her quiver of accomplishments. Also, a mini-group involvement could someday broaden her expertise.




