INTERFAITH FOOD MINISTRY HOLIDAY FOOD DRIVE

Once again, Guild members will have the opportunity to support Interfaith Food Ministry as it provides food to our local neighbors in need. At the December General Meeting, we will be collecting non-perishable food items and/or monetary donations to help provide special holiday meals to food-insecure families in our community. The hope is that through this program approximately, 2,000 local families will enjoy holiday meals they might not otherwise have.

All non-perishable food donations are most gratefully accepted, but especially
needed are high nutrition packed items such as peanut or almond butter, canned
tuna or chicken, as well as canned beans or chili, etc. Other suggested items
include packaged mac & cheese, canned soups, canned veggies and fruits and
breakfast cereals. In addition, sugar-free or low sugar, and gluten free items are
especially welcome for special needs clients.

Cash or check donations will also be collected as part of the IFM Holiday Meals Program. This year due to substantial increased food costs, the suggested donation to provide groceries for a small family holiday meal (1-2 persons) is \$20.00. For a larger family (3+ individuals) the suggested donation is \$50.00. However, as always, any size donation will be gratefully accepted and much appreciated! As in previous years, we will also have donation cards available which indicate a donation has been made in honor of the recipient. These make great holiday gifts for those "hard to find something for" relatives or friends!

PAINT CHIP CHALLENGE

Holiday Projects - March Paint Chip Challenge?

Are you working on Holiday projects? Why not make one that fits the criteria of our March Paint Chip Challenge? Head on over to your local paint or hardware store and browse through the Paint Chip Cards to find a color theme that also fits your holiday theme. Be sure there are Dark, Medium and Light color shades featured on your Paint Chip Card, as these shades must be incorporated into your quilt.

- Fabric guidance: 1) The Paint Chip Color in Dark, Medium and Light shades. 2) The fabrics may be patterned or solid. 3) Other colors allowed are Black, White or Cream. (Use one, two or all three). 4) No other colors may be incorporated.
- Any technique(s) may be used.
- The quilt must be no larger than 40" per side and completely finished (quilted and bound).
- The Quilt Reveal will be at the March 2023, Guild General Meeting. A 3X5 index card with the quilt title and a brief description plus the Paint Chip must be pinned to your quilt.


From Nancy Holtz, Community Service Chair

WE CARE Update from Kathy Biggi


CDF has officially declared the end fire season. However, it never really ends. The Camp Fire in Paradise started on November 8.


