
Don't forget to enter all your wonderful quilts to insure we have a great show. With all this down time, I know people have been quilting (except for power problems).

QUILTING 101

Our beginning quilters' class for January was a delightful day, with a group of eager and enthusiastic students! We started right in learning and/or refreshing our basic skills, focusing on accurate cutting, precise piecing and careful pressing. The result was a variety of colorful rail fence, four-patch and even a few 16 patch blocks.

Unfortunately the snowstorms forced a cancellation of our February class. Should you be reading this before March 23: Quilting 101 is rescheduled for March 30. We will pick up where we left off, learning a variety of methods and techniques for making half-square triangle blocks.

After each class, the members are encouraged to create at least one row of the blocks they learned in that session. Our final project will be to combine six or more rows into a small quilt.
