Quilts, yes, but so much more!

Perched atop a verdant five acre hilltop, Cindy and Larry reveal multiple talents. Larry is a DJ at KVMR and Cindy is a retired Special Education teacher and mixed-media artist.

Check out her write-up in the Summer 2022 Quilting Arts Magazine for the Reader's Challenge! A Youtube enthusiast, Cindy has learned embroidery, matchstick quilting, free-motion and hand quilting, sashimi, clay molding and how to perfect intricate drawings not unlike Zentangles.

Cindy loves taking classes. Participating in a Zoom event call Craft Napa, her three favorite teachers are Judy Coates Perez, Libby Williamson and Lisa Thorpe. What do dryer sheets, tea bags aloe vera gel or cookie cutters have in common? A mixed media artist can make use of almost anything. Cindy is free to explore and have fun.

Cindy loves a bright ambrosia-like palette, always whimsical and featuring oodles of textured treasures, spontaneously crafted, rich in passementerie. Meaningful artifacts and snippets, past and present, bright collections of cheerful sayings and crisp drawings meld seamlessly together. Heart-warming fabric stories of loss and triumph are artfully scrolled on an antique circular thread shaft.

She is a dabbler, self-taught, repurposing ordinary tidbits and demystifying pretentious exactness. Cindy says, "I'm just having fun!" All mediums are considered. Derwent Intense pencils in all colors fill in her ink gel black pen outlines. Also vera gel is painted over these designs to blend colors before heat setting. A Dale Chihuli enthusiast, She even has her own glass kiln and makes decorative stones and dishes!

Cindy's many unique pursuits were a thrill to see. I would LOVE for Cindy to teach Mixed Media Magic for the Guild!







DYED FABRICS: THEY'RE IR-RESIST-ABLE Speaker Workshop - Saturday, July 15, 2023

Learn to create your own beautiful hand-dyed fabrics!

Marjan Kluepfel, our November 2022 Speaker and Workshop instructor, is returning to our Guild to hold a Dye Fabrics Workshop. Since many of us were so enthralled with her gorgeous hand dyed fabrics, we asked her if she could teach us how to do it ourselves.

During this workshop, you will become familiar with the principles of color theory and fabric dyeing using Procion fiber reactive dyes. Many surface design techniques such as immersion dyeing to create color progressions or value gradations, dye painting, bleach discharge, resist techniques, shibori, stamping and stenciling will be included in the workshop.

Go to the PTQG website and use the SignUpGenius link to sign up for the class. The cost is \$35 for members, \$45 for nonmembers. A \$10 per participant lab fee (to cover dyes, paints, chemicals, etc.) will be collected the day of the class. Contact Sue Marshall, Speaker Workshop Chair, for more information.

Coming to our Guild in September

Velda Newman, a local fiber artist known throughout the International Quilting World, will be our September Speaker and Workshop guest. Her large scale designs, portraying subjects from nature, have been exhibited extensively throughout the United States, Europe, Australia and Japan. Newman uses textiles and thread the way other artists use paint and brush. Her primary source of inspiration is the natural world and her exquisitely crafted quilts reflect the detail and design she finds there. Her work has appeared in many national and international publications and exhibitions including featured artist in 2018, at the first International Show in Mexico. Her work, "HYDRANGEA", was selected as one of the 100 Best Quilts of the 20th Century.

In her workshop, "Texture and Form", we will learn how to get rid of the "flat"

look and turn fabric into something interesting. These easy machine stitching techniques can be used for quilts or clothing. (Book reference: A Workshop with Velda Newman; available now @ Amazon.com or C & T Publishing.com.)
