Born and raised in Nevada County, 30 young years ago, Dallas has been here longer than many of us. She blends in fittingly with seasoned quilters and older gals. Dallas' heart clamors for all things nostalgic and retro: those thrift store finds, well-loved fabrics of yesteryear, antiquities with heart. She introduced me to her fave: "Enid and Edgar", a new vintage clothing store in the old Hospice building on Zion St. Candid and self-assured, Dallas remarked: "I go to Cancer Thrift almost every day!" Buying second-hand jeans, she expertly paints a lily down one leg and a partridge down the other. Embroidered floral motifs complete the desired look on each pocket. Fabric paint is heat set for successful washings. Dallas is a graduate of Lewis and Clark liberal arts college in Portland,



Oregon with a BA in Studio Arts. Her artistry is endearing; her confidence evident.

Using Mom's sweet antique 1960's Singer "Genie", Dallas has boldly mastered patchwork quilting. Ambitious and undaunted, she remarks, "I'm always creating something!" (What else ya gonna do during Covid, right?!) Each project reflects "old in a new way". Two quilted jackets are eye-catching. (Mariah take notice!)

Dallas has an on-line store on Instagram whereby she sells her professional pottery. An old-fashioned kiln built in the 70's looks like a small cabin in the woods! Once a year she and several like-minded potters fire up their 28-hour baking enterprise: chopping wood, stoking the fire, maintaining the right temperature! It's old school, but provides great fun for like-minded afficionados. She's even been known to dig up natural clay in our area for specific projects.

One day a week Dallas works at Kitkidizzi in downtown Nevada City, a fun boutique chock full of ornamental obsessions. As a true visionary, Dallas will dive right in to tackle any craft. At meetings she helps with the Treasure Table—always smiling. How lucky we are to experience her versatility, her spontaneity, her willingness.
