The classes are on our Website but just to refresh your memory...

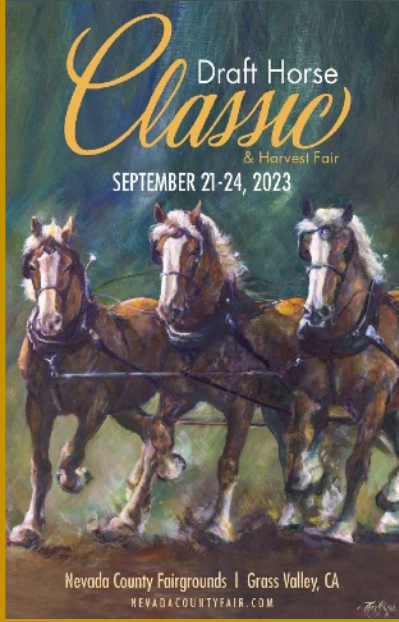
- Christine Barnes will be demonstrating her magical use of color by teaching her Spumoni quilt.

Arlene Arnold will be the November 6, speaker. Arlene is a Quilt Historian who will share her great-great grandmother's, Lucretia, journey from Kentucky to California in 1864. Hear excerpts from Lucretia's diary while viewing quilts made from 1820 to 1870 that illustrate her words.

"Lucretia's Journey" will be the workshop on Wednesday, November 7. Create this great quilt in the classic way consisting of four 20-inch blocks. Arlene has developed a method that eliminates several seams and requires fewer pieces to create a flat finish. This is a fast quilt that can be expanded to fit any size bed.
