PIQF Pacific International Quilt Festival

Each year I think what I see can't be outdone. Textiles on steroids, bedazzling compositions, alluring dreamscapes evoking heart-pumping emotion. Mingling among the world's best, seven of us from PTQG went on Thursday's Needle Nellie's bus. Sue, Robi, Julia, Debra, Ginny, Mariah and myself. A 13-hour odyssey so worth it!

Special exhibits were intermingled, not judged:

1. Cherrywood hand-dyes , PIQF's popular anchor, featured a plethora of "Graffiti" themed 20x20 quilts. Fun and humorous.

2. Rami Kim reigned supreme with 15 over-the-top ensembles. Does she really wear these? Down to the gnat's eyeball with detail: beading, ribbon embroidery, origami, thread painting, sparkles, etc.

3. A sizable circus-colored topographical map of California by Lin Schiffner was exciting to see, a special exhibit for our state.

4. Razor-sharp digital photography on fabric, machine quilted.

5. Mountain Art Quilters including quilts by Julie Berry, Sophia Day, Pat Gillings, Linda Lasich, Stephanie and Bennett-Strauss.





In my whirlwind to do all and see all, these were my faves:

1. Grand winner from Tokyo, "Blue Tone II" by Aki Sakai featured infinitesimal machine

stitching, 1/16th inch meandering, handwork, beads, sparkles, all in dreamy pale blue.

2. Two large "Dear Jane" quilts, precision to the max with inventive borders. Is "Dear Jane" making a comeback? Sue Deane and Mariah Bath are making these 4-1/2 inch blocks, too.

3. "Remembrance" by Judith Phelps with show-stopping winter scene, thread painted to be equally gorgeous on the back.



4. "Glade Creek Grist Mill" also thread-painted. Such depth with waterfall, wheel, creek, 64x47 by Barbara Malzke.

5. "Date Night" a sushi platter by Kestrel Michaud, 36x48. The food was perfectly set on an awesome silver tray! (Should have won a ribbon!)

6. "Wetland Romance" by Kathy McNeill, 49x42. Zillions of layers of rocks in water, with audacious life-like frog border.

7. Artichoke blooms, small and precise, 14x18, a perfect composition of muted and subdued hues.

8. Velda's ginormous irises befitting a museum wall, her handiwork causing quite a stir. People were in awe.

At 2:45 pm (bus left at 3:00!) I hastily shopped my new-found favorite booth: Peacock Collections from Pacific Grove. Featuring antique and vintage passementerie, fabrics, doodads, quilt blocks. Hurriedly, with credit cards ready, Mariah and I were utterly besotted.

Where will it all end? What can we think up next? Quilting machines doing impossible meanderings, hand-sewn mini piping amongst sparkles and teeny trapunto hand-appliqués. Highly disciplined ornamentation, quilts with heartfelt stories depicting famous places or hometown landmarks. You can always tell when a quilt-maker's heart is really in it. Quilting is our labor of love, our passion. Let's go again!
