Be prepared for some Fun and Games when you come to our February 6th General Meeting. Mel Beach, our February Speaker, is a San Jose based quilt artist, teacher and lecturer, who breaks away from tradition by adding her own modern, beautifully textured, and colorful twists. Her quilts have been juried into national quilt shows and traveling exhibits, published in books/magazines, earned awards/ribbons, and selected as

Finalists. She will share nine favorite ways to incorporate fun and games into one's quilting including: rolling the dice to explore new design possibilities, playing card inspirations, and, according to Mel "Everything is awesome when Lego bricks are involved". She hopes to inspire us to develop a game plan for adding some creative play into our day.

Mel's Speaker Workshop held on the following day, February 7th, is "Warning: Modern, Improv Curves Ahead!" Buckle up for a new take on modern, improv curves! We'll experiment and play with topstitch appliquéd curves that are Finished, Freeing, Forgiving, and FUN! Once you see how quick and easy it is to create these improvisational curves, we'll add a modern, curvy twist to traditional quilt designs including borders, Pinwheels, Chinese Coins, Log Cabins, and Drunkard's Path blocks.

February 2024 President's Message

We had a superb meeting with our Charter Members at the Guild's first meeting for 2024. I extend our grateful thanks to Heidi Emmett, Janet Palmer, Ina Gibson, Marilyn Engelking, Joy Waggener and Joan Hartung for sharing their stories about the Guild's early days.

It started with Betty Maddox's simple question "Would you like to learn to quilt with others?" The Guild first meeting had 48 folks and simply kept growing. Did you know the first hosted Guild speaker was Alex Anderson? Or a float featuring a Velda Newman quilt won the mayor's trophy in Nevada City's July 4th parade? Or that our Education Outreach Program, under Margaret Boothby's leadership, started as trunk shows to retirement homes and local schools? Our history is full of remarkable people achieving amazing things!



I have every confidence we will continue the tradition of creative ideas with community support (internally and externally) and the incredible people in our Guild.

We also launched a Pillowcase Drive in support of "Ryan's Case for Smiles." This national, nonprofit organization works with volunteers to provide each child (18 years and younger) in pediatric cancer centers with a pillowcase for use during their hospital stay. These pillowcases bring a smile to each child. Our Guild goal is to send 1500 pillowcases to the Sacramento Chapter by September 14, 2024, during national cancer awareness month. The pillowcases will go to UC Davis, Sutter Health and Mercy San Juan, Carmichael hospitals. See page five for more information.

Pine Tree Quilt Guild Pillowcase Drive Supporting the Sacramento Chapter of Ryan's Case for Smiles

September is National Childhood Cancer Awareness month, a disease which affects over 40,000 children in our country each year. *Ryan's Case for Smiles*, a national non-profit organization, wants to deliver one pillowcase to each child in cancer treatment. Ryan's Case for Smiles works with thousands of volunteers to create, package, and deliver pillowcases to children in over 363 hospitals, Ronald McDonald Houses and hospice facilities.

PTQG is teaming up with the *Ryan's Case for Smiles* Chapter in Sacramento. Our goal is to create and send 1500 pillowcases to the Sacramento Chapter Coordinator by September 14, 2024. Our completed pillowcases will be packaged and prepared for delivery to the following hospitals:

- · Sutter Health Children's Center.
- UC- Davis, Sacramento.
- Mercy San Juan Hospital

Ryan's Case for Smiles accepts sewn pillowcases only. The "Game Rules" for making each pillowcase are listed below:

These pillowcases are for children 18 years old and younger.

- Fabric needs to be 100% cotton or flannel. Use fun, colorful novelty prints!
- · Avoid fabrics with glitter.
- Be cautious with red fabrics; they tend to bleed.
- · Pillowcases need to be washed and pressed.

Wash fabric before sewing pillowcase or once the pillowcase is made.

- Avoid use of scented detergent or dryer sheets.
- Please press pillowcases once cleaned (without spray starch, etc.).
- Adding a trim piece to the pillowcase is optional.

Bead Embroidery For Quilters

Thom Atkins will share his fascination with beads and quilting on Tuesday, April 2. Thom will share some of his award winning quilts and provide a look at how he approaches each new quilt from start to finish. For more inspiration and information go to thomatkins.com.

The "Bead Embroidery for Quilters" workshop takes place on April 3 at St. Canice Center in Nevada City. We will take a look at beads — their shapes, varieties of finishes, and use on quilts to create texture and color changes. Whether you're a beginner or experienced, using your class kit, you will learn the basic stitches and techniques for applying beads, what they do to the surface of the quilt, and how the application of beads quilts the surface. You will learn how to add dimension, texture, drama and sparkle to your piece. Take what you've learned in this workshop to make your own quilts, embellish your art pieces or add unique beauty to garments! This is a process class. The student should have some prior knowledge of hand sewing and hand quilting.

"That's Right, Ethel! Measure twice, cut once, then fudge it to fit."

A humorous quip found in Julie's oh-so-perfect sewing room—a large and welcoming studio up a long flight of stairs. All hers! A 14-foot Handi-Quilter is her prized possession. She is becoming very adept at programming its zillion choices for design, space, size, length, height, etc. At first she says: "I learned how to scribble." But she's now advanced to greater heights, admitting: "I'm not really a computer nerd." Community Service quilting has proven to be her best learning curve. Now, after three years practice, Julie's business card promotes "LOFTY QUILTING" as a viable endeavor. She's open for business.



Julie was taught to sew by mom and encouraged by an aunt and grandfather, and made all her clothes for going to school. Even bathing suits and a wedding dress! She's been sewing since 8 years old. Just give her a task and she's tenacious. Julie just completed 5 bed-sized quilts, twin 72x90, for her family's Christmas presents!

Having been a nurse for 30 years, Julie loves her job. She is at the Endoscopy Center now for just 40 hours per month. She's semi-retired and enjoys a home near Scotts Flat Lake with her retired fire-fighter husband, Ronald. Her sewing room, in a loft above the kitchen, looks out onto a most beautiful pine tree setting.

Another plaque, "IRONY—the opposite of wrinkly" brings humor to the space. An orderly stash arranged by fabric size makes selection easier. A box of panels is separated from stacks of $\frac{1}{4}$ yds, $\frac{1}{2}$ yds, 1 yd, 2 yd and fats. Julie has taught a tote bag class with a pre-cut star design, charm pack and batting. She quipped: " I love photographs in quilts. I think they are so special." There was her daughter's wedding as a perfect remembrance in fabric. In all of Julie's quilts, her binding and mitered

corners were perfectly executed, confidently awaiting a persnickety judge's trained eye.
