Looking Forward to April's Program Thom Atkins Shares his Award Winning Quilts



Renowned artist, award-winning quilter, teacher and author, Thom

Atkins, will speak at our April 2nd General Meeting. Thom uses
beads to add texture, dimension, drama and lifelike details to his quilted creations. He will
demonstrate how beads and fabric are integrated into the design of the quilts and how both are
essential to the overall composition. Bronze sculpture was Thom Atkin's first love until a
traffic accident made it not possible. He turned to beads and fabric. He will show us some of

his award winning quilts and provide a look at how he approaches each new quilt from start to

The "Bead Embroidery for Quilters" workshop takes place on April 3 at St. Canice Center in Nevada City. We will take a look at beads - their shapes, varieties of finishes, and use on quilts to create texture and color changes. Whether you're a beginner or experienced, using your class kit you will learn the basic stitches and techniques for applying beads, what they do to the surface of the quilt, and how the application of beads quilts the surface. You will learn how to add dimension, texture drama and sparkle to your piece. Take what you've learned in this workshop to make your own quilts, embellish your art pieces or add unique beauty to garments! This is a process

"Inch by inch, row by row, we will make our quilts grow!"



On June 27, zippered bags are the focus. Zippers are scary for many, but can be doable. So come, make a zippered bag for pencils, sewing items, or a gift. All of the ones pictured follow the same "pattern". The shape changes are due to sewn corners. Come and join in.

Celebrating 40 Years with a brief history of the Guild...

WHERE IT ALL BEGAN PTQG History

On a very warm day in July, 1984, Betty Maddox rounded up more than 40 sewists who gathered in front of Heidi's (Emmett) Fabrics in Grass Valley and asked, "Would you like to get together with some other women and quilt?"



The Pine Tree Quilt Guild was born.

Betty would act as President. The purpose would be to "contribute to the growth of knowledge about quilting techniques, patterns, history and quilt making by providing educational meetings, fun and fellowship."

They would meet the first Tuesday of the month at Hennessy School and dues would be \$12 a year. They would select a Board of Directors, and By-laws and Policies would be established.

The name would be "Pine Tree Quilt Guild of Nevada County" and the logo, appropriately, a pieced green pine tree.

A library was established to provide the tools for the better knowledge of quilting. The donations started rolling in and there was a raffle at each meeting with the proceeds used to buy more books that could be checked out and returned the following month.

Now, fully underway with over 50 members, the wheels started turning and ideas on how to expand and enhance the Guild were plentiful.

The first Newsletter was published in October by editors Tina Murray and Joy Waggener. Joy had a computer and the knowledge to use it. There was a Block-of-the-Month project, Mystery Gift and Quarter yard Club drawings at the meetings with tickets selling 5 for \$1. Secret Pals and Show-and-Tell were among favorite activities.

Pine Tree Quilt Guild HIstory continued.....

FLASH! BIG NEWS! The Pine Tree Quilt Guild is Going to Sponsor a Quilt Show!

The Children's Home Society was not planning to continue their quilt show in the spring. So, the Board of Directors jumped at the opportunity. It would take everyone's participation since it was only six months away. Committees were formed and "Springtime in the Pines" became a reality.

They would gather recipes to make a cookbook to sell at the Country Store.



Home Workshops, Mini-Groups, a Treasure Table and a Scholarship program were implemented with the first \$300 scholarship awarded to a Nevada Union student in May, 1986. Community Service provided bed caddies for Hospice of the Foothills.

Margaret Boothby and friends traveled to schools and senior facilities with "Trunk Shows" (now called Education Outreach). "Road to California" was an original play depicting the art of quilting and California history complete with costumes. It was recognized by Nevada County Superintendent of Schools as an appropriate addtion to their curriculum.

Guild-sponsored bus trips to local quilt shows were a favorite activity, with the furthest trip to Sisters, Oregon.

We are dedicated to our founding mothers for their foresight and energy in establishing the Pine Tree Quilt Guild. Forty years later, not much has changed, not even the price of a raffle ticket!


