Not Too Late to Sign Up for Thom's Workshop



Wednesday's, April 3rd, Speaker Workshop, "Bead Embroidery for Quilters" still has a few open spots. To sign up go to our PTQG website, click on Upcoming Events and look for Thom's workshop or contact Margaret Vodicka. Our Speaker Workshop Chair will be on a trip so Margaret is substituting for her. The cost is \$35 plus an additional \$25 for the kit that contains most of the materials needed for the class.

Thom's workshop will take a look at beads - their shapes, varieties of finishes, and use on quilts to create texture and color changes. Whether you're a beginner or experienced, by using your class kit, you will learn the basic stitches and techniques for applying beads, what they do to the surface of the quilt and how the application of beads quilts the surface. You will learn how to add dimension, texture drama and sparkle to your piece. This is a process class. The student should have some prior knowledge of hand sewing and hand quilting. The class will be held at St. Canice Center on Reward Street in Nevada City. Doors open at 9:00, class starting at 9:30 and ending at 3:00. There are still openings available.

Guild Challenge Update

Challenge Quilts Revealed at our Quilt Show

Congratulations to all our Quilt Challenge Participants for completing a quilt and challenging yourselves. We would have loved to "Reveal" the quilts at our March meeting but, once again, the weather did not cooperate. We will

be displaying your Challenge Quilts at our Quilt Show in a special exhibit and ask Quilt Show attendees to vote for their favorite. Please go to our website and enter your quilt into the Quilt Show. You can enter them for judging or as show only. Make sure to mark "Guild Challenge".

Some of you may have been pressed for time to complete your Challenge Quilt. Now you have the opportunity and time to finish it and enter your Challenge Quilt into the Show. As a reminder, the theme is "40", which can be: 40 blocks, a symbol representing the number 40, memories of the past 40 years, a 40th anniversary cake, what happened 40 years ago, etc., etc.

- You may use any technique(s).
- The quilt must be no larger than 40" per side and completely finished with a sleeve and label.
- Enter your Quilt into the Quilt Show, and mark it as "Guild Challenge".
- You may ask to have the quilt judged or for show only.
- At our May 7th Guild meeting, we ask that you bring in your Challenge
 Quilt so that our members can admire your quilt, plus Ribbons will be
 awarded at that time.







Tiny red, white and blue squares form a dazzling design meant to equally reflect music and fishing. A traveling family, many photos bespoke exotic locales. Helena said: "When we went to Christmas Island in the South Pacific, they (husband Bert, son Bert and son Max), all fly-fished while I sat peacefully on the beach to hand sew." Sublime.

Favorite designers featuring colorful animals include Tula Pink and Anna Maria Horner. Helena utilizes U-tube for paper piecing instruction and attends sewing retreats afar. Sewtopia in Utah and a retreat in Nashville sound enticing. Her razzle dazzle enthusiasm immerses her in riotous hot pinks, Nile greens and blazing orange choices, sometimes with a snow white background. Her Christmas quilts are not screaming traditional red and green Santa Clauses. Assertive snowmen are hot pink; whacky Christmas trees may be purple. Impeccable paper piecing is her fave.

Have you seen the "temperature quilt"? For all of 2023 she recorded the high and low for 365 days. A chosen color (hot ones, cold ones) represented each temperature. An intricate tumbling zigzag-ish pattern will be the result. She's just half finished and we'll love to see it!

Helena has been in the Guild one year. As a good pal to Quilt Show Co-Chairman Rachel Pena, a fellow "Mod", Helena is our treasurer for the

upcoming show. She also works with foster youth in an administrative position in the field of education in the Superintendent's office. A busy gal.

Celebrating 40 Years with a brief history of the Guild...



WHERE IT ALL BEGAN PTQG History

On a very warm day in July, 1984, Betty Maddox rounded up more than 40 sewists who gathered in front of *Heidi's* (Emmett) *Fabrics* in Grass Valley and asked, "Would you like to get together with some other women and quilt?"



The Pine Tree Quilt Guild was born.

Betty would act as President. The purpose would be to "contribute to the growth of knowledge about quilting techniques, patterns, history and quilt making by providing educational meetings, fun and fellowship."

They would meet the first Tuesday of the month at Hennessy School and dues would be \$12 a year. They would select a Board of Directors and By-laws and Policies would be established.

The name would be "Pine Tree Quilt Guild of Nevada County" and the logo, appropriately, a pieced green pine tree.



A library was established to provide the tools for the better knowledge of quilting. The donations started rolling in and there was a raffle at each meeting with the proceeds used to buy more books that could be checked out and returned the following month.

Now, fully underway with over 50 members, the wheels started turning and ideas on how to expand and enhance the Guild were plentiful.

The first Newsletter was published in October by editors Tina Murray and Joy Waggener. Joy had a computer and the knowledge to use it. There was a Block-of-the-Month project, Mystery Gift and Quarter yard Club drawings at the meetings with tickets selling 5 for \$1. Secret Pals and Showand-Tell were among favorite activities.

Pine Tree Quilt Guild HIstory continued.....



FLASH! BIG NEWS! The Pine Tree Quilt Guild is Going to Sponsor a Quilt Show!

The Children's Home Society was not planning to continue their quilt show in the spring. So, the Board of Directors jumped at the opportunity. It would take everyone's participation since it was only six months away. Committees were formed and "Springtime in the Pines" became a reality.

They would gather recipes to make a cookbook to sell at the Country Store.

Home Workshops, Mini-Groups, a Treasure Table and a Scholarship program were implemented with the first \$300 scholarship awarded to a Nevada Union student in May, 1986. Community Service provided bed caddies for Hospice of the Foothills.

Margaret Boothby and friends traveled to schools and senior facilities with "Trunk Shows" (now called Education Outreach). "Road to California" was an original play depicting the art of quilting and California history complete with costumes. It was recognized by Nevada County Superintendent of Schools as an appropriate addition to their curriculum.

Guild-sponsored bus trips to local quilt shows were a favorite activity, with the furthest trip to Sisters, Oregon.



We are dedicated to our founding mothers for their foresight and energy in establishing the Pine Tree Quilt Guild. Forty years later, not much has changed, not even the price of a raffle ticket!
